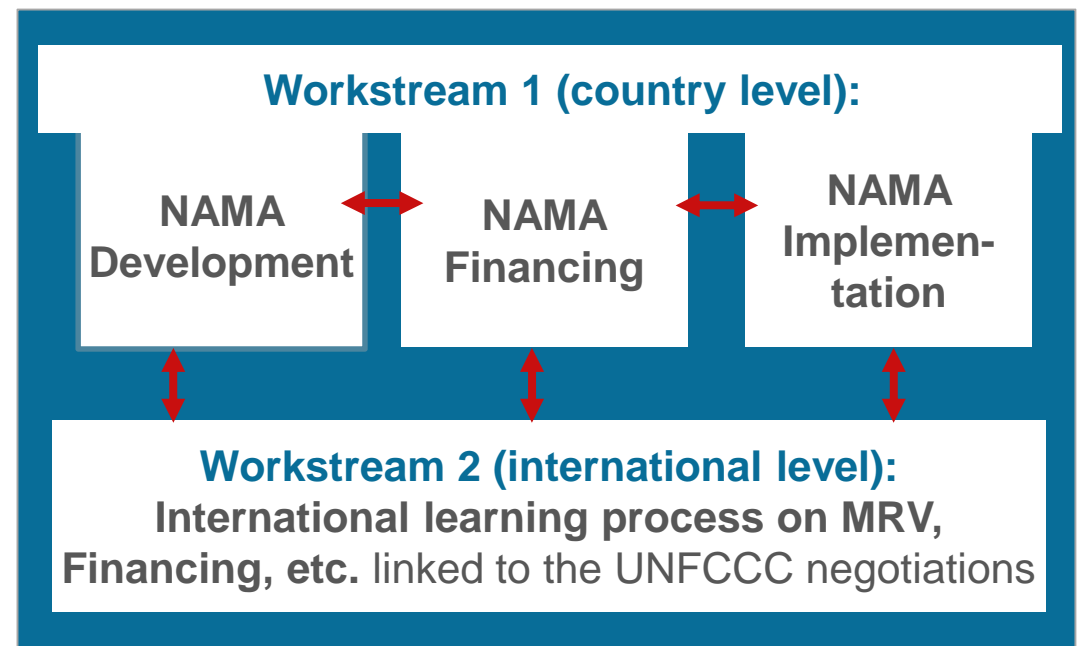
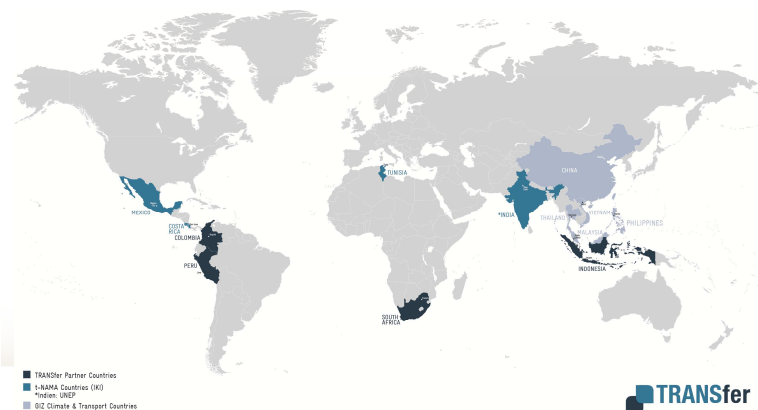
- GIZ's purpose is to promote international cooperation for sustainable development.

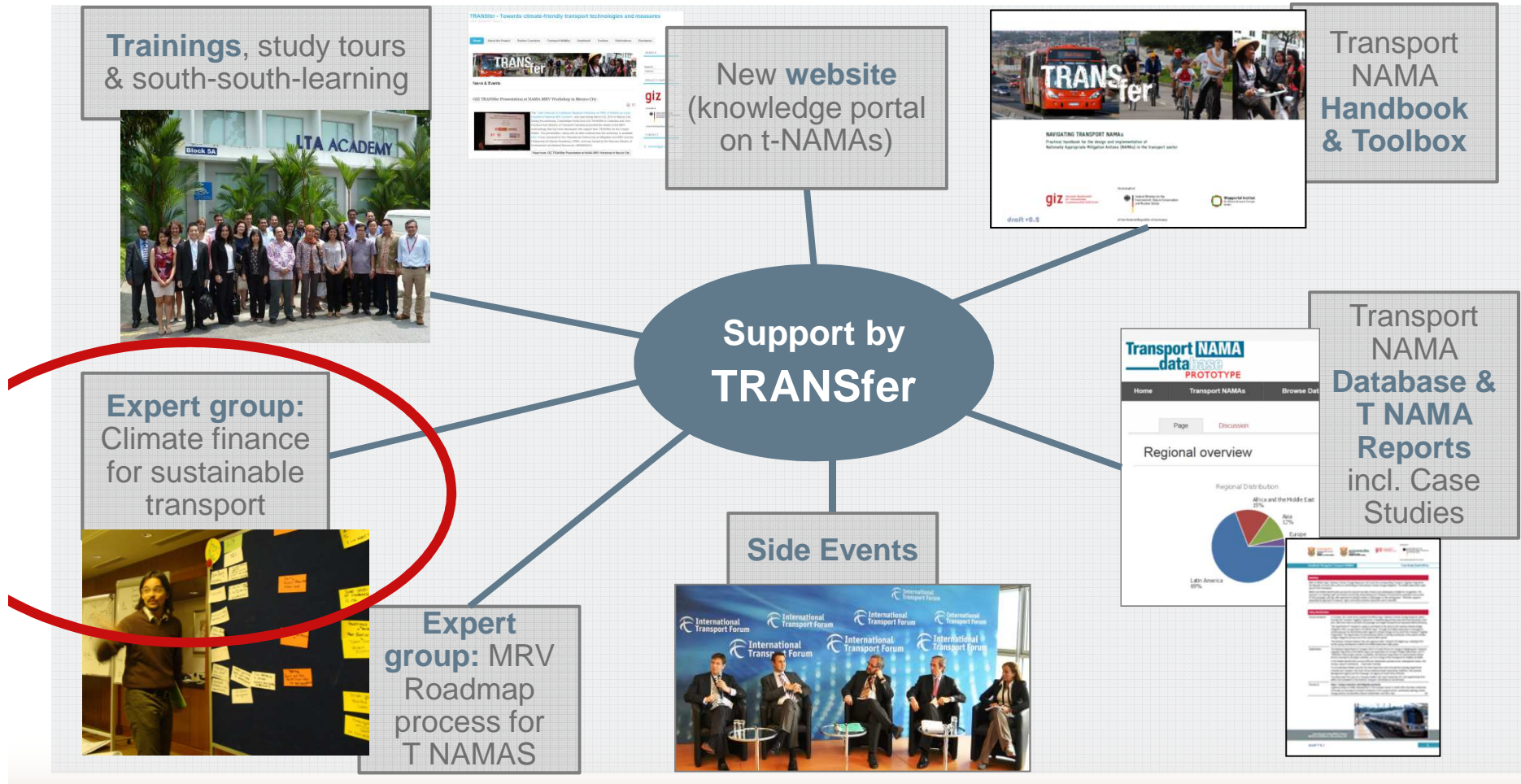
Towards climate-friendly transport technologies and measures

- **Objective:** Developing and emerging economies increasingly contribute to GHG mitigation in transport using NAMAs.
- **Budget:** €7 million (2010-2016, BMUB funded)
- **Partners:** COL, SA, IDN, PERU + associated countries





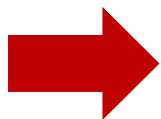

Why an expert group on CF for sustainable transport?

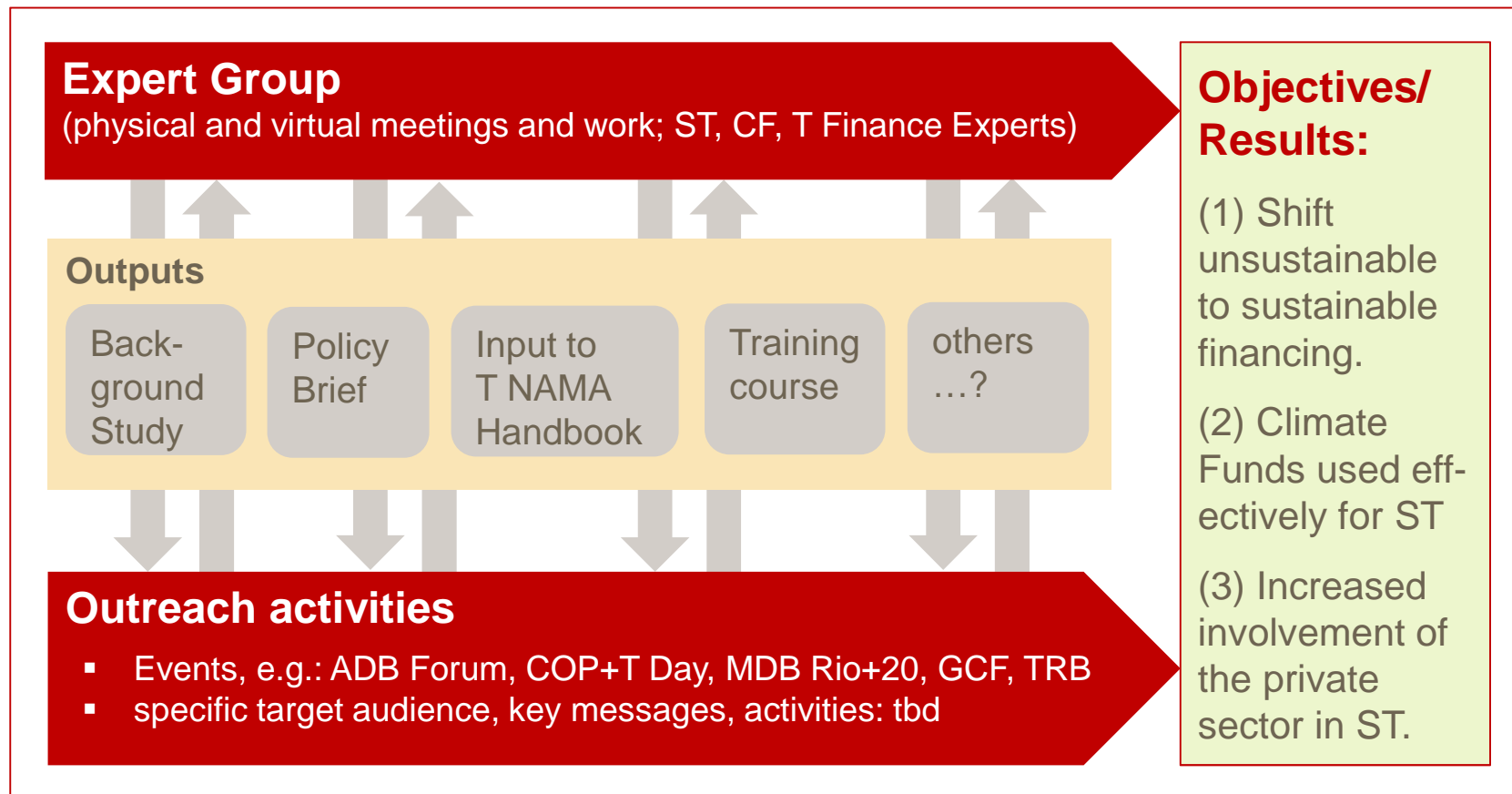
- **CF can cover only a small portion** of the investment needs
=> CF needs to be used in a particularly smart way to be effective.
- used well, CF has the potential to trigger a **shift from unsustainable towards more sustainable** transport investments
- need to tap potential of **private sector** involvement in ST financing.
- **no clear understanding yet** how CF should be applied most effectively for different types of ST measures
- CDM didn't work for transport but the **new CF architecture** should!
