Description

Transport causes 25% of energy-related GHG Emissions worldwide. Innovative mobility solutions are available to reduce emissions, and mitigation policies are being developed at national and sub-national levels. However, further efforts will be necessary to reach the 2°-scenario. Through different instruments like the IKI and the NAMA Facility, Germany supports a large variety of low carbon transport projects worldwide. International experts, politicians and practitioners will discuss recent trends, good practices and challenges in the field of low carbon transport policies and how the level of ambition can be further raised in the transport sector.
